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
Community Resilience Partnership Municipal Resolution

WHEREAS, the Town of Dover-Foxcroft has completed the Community Resilience Partnership's Community Resilience Self-Assessment and List of Community Actions, and held a community workshop on January 19, 2022, which prioritized the following action areas: 1. Conduct a community vulnerability assessment that identifies climate risks and vulnerable populations and includes a review of existing plans and policies. Adopt a climate resilience plan that describes high priority strategies for reducing risk and vulnerabilities. 2. Develop and implement an extreme temperatures emergency plan, including strategies that increase availability of warming and cooling centers for residents 3. Adopt policies that enable, support or incentivize local food production and consumption 4. Improve and protect drinking water and wastewater treatment facilities to reduce physical damage and sustain functioning during extreme weather events.

BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Dover-Foxcroft commits to participating in the Community Resilience Partnership, which supports community leadership in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and increasing resiliency to extreme weather and climate change impacts;


